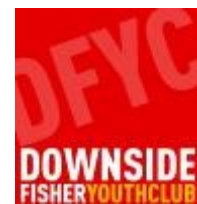
### Book Corner Competition

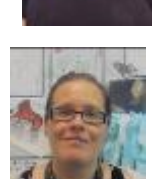
### Going for Gold!

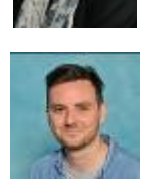
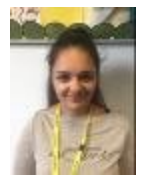


# Classes of 2017—2018
