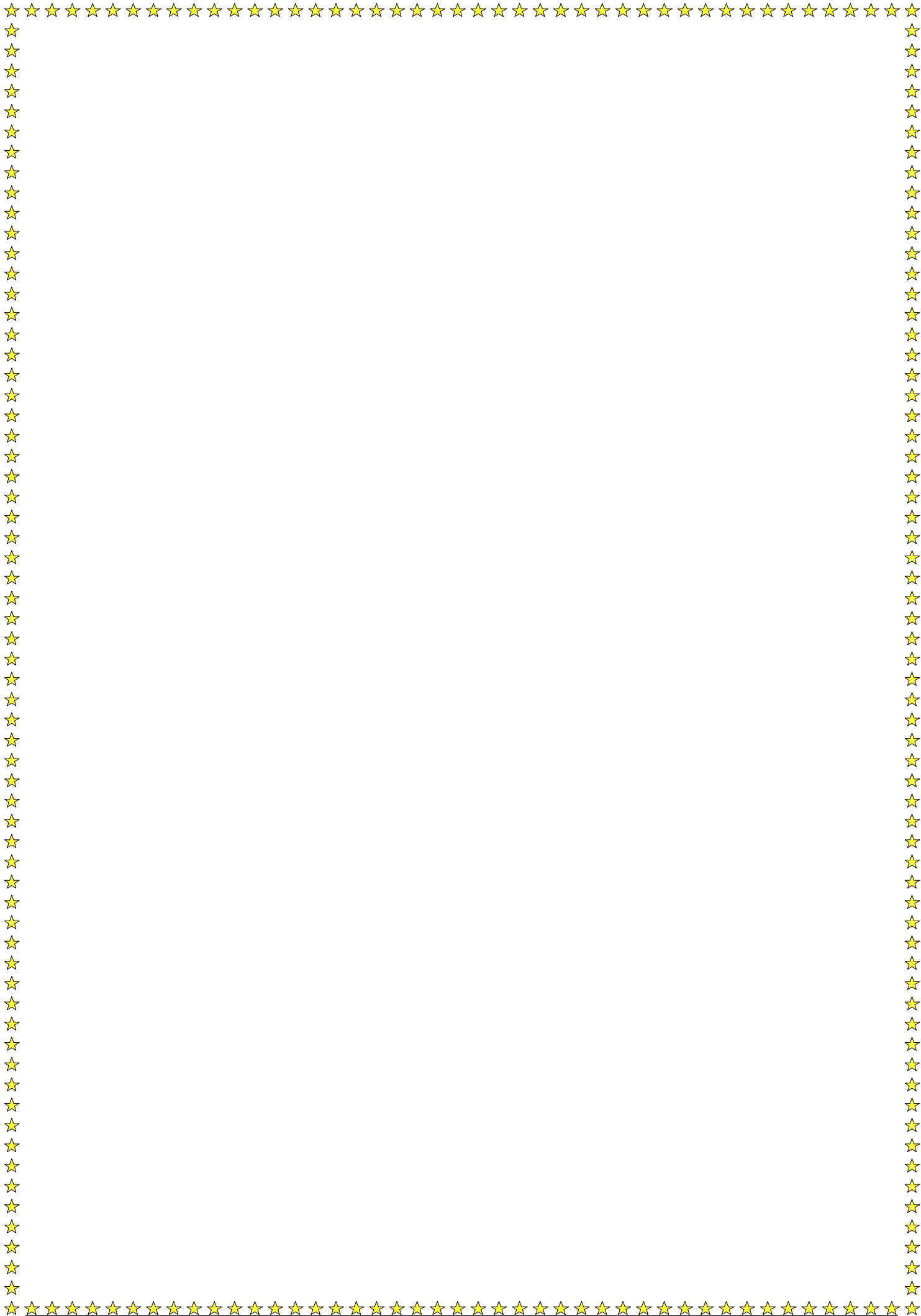


Purple Class Assembly
