5 Questions to Ask Your Child About their Day at School

Get a sense of your child's life at school by asking them to describe how their day went. It might be a good idea to start the conversation with an anecdote from your own day. Try one of these conversation-starters:

- 1. Tell me about the best part of your day.
- 2. What was the hardest thing you had to do today?
- 3. Did any of your classmates do anything funny?
- 4. Tell me about what you read in class.
- 5. Who did you play with today? What did you play?
