If your child is not attending school and is eligible for Free School meals you may receive a meal voucher from Edenred (the national scheme) during the current COVID-19 pandemic.

If eligible, your child's school will gain welcome additional funding, known as 'Pupil Premium'.

Lambeth and Southwark's Summer of food and fun
