#### Key Vocabulary:

Food: recipe, ingredients, fruits, vegetables, meat sweet, salty, taste, like, dislike, preparation, breakfast, lunch, dinner, main, dessert, grow, farm.

Celebrations: Diwali, Eid, Hanukka, Christmas, births, birthdays, weddings, achievements, religion, party, special clothes, festivals, decorations, respect, music, traditions,

How will the topic link to our community? How will social, moral, spiritual & cultural links be made?:

We will talk about the food we have at school and how it is the same and different to the food we have at home.

We will link our cooking activities to the celebrations we are learning about and encourage all children to share their experiences.

### How can you help? Is there homework?

•Read with your child every night. Ask questions such as: Who is your favourite character in the story? Which picture do you like? Why? Can you show me the words/ pictures/ title? Do not forget to also ask questions such as 'I wonder if...', 'What would you if...'

\*Explore Maths with your child such as size, numbers, time and patterns.

•Choose an activity from the homework sheet to do together.

What is your favourite food? Why?
Where do fruits come from? Where does meat come from?
How do you make bread?
What traditions do you have in your family?
What do you celebrate? And how?
Do you have any special family recipes?
