Emergency Grants for School Uniforms

They also provide grants for the purchase of school uniforms for families experiencing exceptional financial hardship. This is how our parents can claim an emergency uniform grant.

 If you are aware that a child does not have a school uniform due to exceptional financial hardship, then we would welcome an application for an emergency grant to purchase school uniform for that child

Applications are made online from our website, www.newcomencollett.org.uk

- Once you click on the home page where it states "apply here for a uniform grant", you will be taken to the application page. There you will need to register, by inputting a current email address and password.
- By return you will be sent an email to confirm your registration login and once you click this you can commence an application for a uniform grant (please check junk mail for this).
- If the application is approved, you will receive an email with a letter of offer and claim form.
- Once you have purchased the uniform, all that is left to do is to upload your claim form and receipt on to your online account (clicking the My Applications button on the left-hand side of the screen). Applications must be made on the authority of the headteacher.
- The application must be submitted before the uniform is purchased.
- The school must purchase the uniform for the child, not the parent.
- Grants up to £100 per child are available (subject to funds being available).

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you and your families are all well and keeping safe.

Last night the Government confirmed that schools will reopen for all pupils on Monday 8th March 2021.

So what does that mean for you?

- School will reopen to all year groups from Nursery to Year 6 on **Monday 8th March.**
- All children will be expected to attend. School will be compulsory again and families who don't attend may face fines.
- We will be able to offer Breakfast Club and After School Club from Monday 8th March.
- There will be no school clubs after school.
- Many of the current protocols will remain; hygiene and hand washing, frequent cleaning.
- You must drop off your child between 8.45am and 9.00am. This will mean that we can continue to stagger the arrival
 of all our families.
- Pick up times will be as they were in the autumn term.
- All children will be brought to the playground at the end of the day.
- Only 1 parent is allowed to drop off/collect their child/ren and face masks should be worn
- Please make sure you are social distancing from other families and that you follow the instructions from school staff to ensure everyone's safety.
- Visitors and parents/carers cannot enter the site and/or gather at school gates.
- Please continue to phone and email us if you need to share information or ask questions. You will not have the usual daily contact with the teaching staff. We will not be sending home letters etc. and minimising any face to face contact. We will call or email you instead (this includes if your child has an accident).
- All children must wear school uniform.
- All children can wear PE kits to school on their class PE days.
- The children will be allowed to bring in a water bottle and their book bags and bring books home again.
- Whole year group or Phase bubbles will be created as they were last term.
- Where possible children will sit in rows facing the front.
- Children don't have to social distance in their bubbles
 Staff will maintain social distancing.
- Staff will continue to take lateral flow Covid tests twice weekly.
- We will be following our normal school timetable and curriculum.
- Lunchtimes will be staggered so only one bubble is in the hall at a time. Tables and benches will then be cleaned before the next bubble enters.
- Playtimes will be staggered and classes will be allocated an area of the playground to use.
- We will plan interventions to help children catch up on the learning they have missed this year.
- If you have been loaned a school Chromebook or router we will expect these to be returned on Monday 8th March. Any damages or lost items must be paid for. Please refer to your loan agreement for further information.
- Please return any other school resources on Monday 8th March.

Responding to a suspected case of Coronavirus

Please do not send your child to school if they are unwell. If they have a high temperature, loss of smell or taste or a new, continuous, dry cough, please let us know and book your child to be tested immediately. There are a list of other symptoms available on the NHS and Government website.

Anyone displaying Coronavirus symptoms in school will be sent home immediately and will need to follow the Government guidelines for self isolation.

- Child with symptoms will be sent home and must arrange a test
- Siblings will be sent home
- Other children in that group can continue to come to school until the test results are back
- If the test is positive, the symptomatic child must self- isolate for 10 days, siblings for 10 days and the same group children and staff for 10 days. We will also notify Public Health England in Southwark for further guidance
- If negative, the child can return when better
- If parents refuse to test their child, we will notify Public Health England in Southwark who will follow this up with the family, GP and complete a risk assessment. They will advise the school on our next steps.

Thank you all again for your continued support. I am sure you will also want to join me in thanking all the staff across our Federation who have continued to work throughout this pandemic and put the needs of our children and families first.

TikTok is a video-sharing social media app available on iOS and Android which lets users create, share, and view user created videos much in a similar manner to Facebook, Instagram and Snapchat. It's main draw, however, is that users can record and upload bite-sized looping videos of themselves lip-syncing and dancing to popular music or soundbites, often for comedic effect, which can then be further enhanced with filters, emojis and stickers. TikTok has been designed with the young user in mind and has a very addictive appeal. At the beginning of 2019 it skyrocketed in popularity to become the iOS store's most downloaded app with over 33 million downloads. Estimates suggest that it now has anything between 500 million and over 1 billion monthly active users worldwide.





What parents need to know about

TIKTOK



MATURE CONTENT

On the IOS store, TikTok is listed as 12+. On the Google Play Store it is rated as "Parental guidance recommended." When signing up for the app, it's possible to lie about your age without any form of verification. As children scroll through their feed, rose of of the videos they're likely to come across are lighthearted or funny takes on disnor routines which are designed to make people laugh. However there has been a slew of videos which have been reported for featuring drug and atoolot abuse, self-harm and sexual content, including young teems thresting overtly sexually and behaving suggestively. Given the deluge of material upleaded to TikTok every day, it's impossible to moderate everything and it can be quite common to come across explicit content on the for you' feed when logging into the platform.

INAPPROPRIATE MUSIC

TREOs revolves around creating music videos through lip-syncing and dancing. Inevitably, some of the music featured by users will contain explicit or suggestive lyrics. Given the undenlably young user base, there is a risk that children muy look to limitate the explicit language they have or the suggestive actions they see when viewing others user's videos on the app.

TIKTOK FAME

TikTok is very image focused and there is a notable preoccupation appearing cool and attractive. Many teonages now attempt to go and become what's known in-app as TikTok famous. TikTok famous. TikTok famous to work to work



As a social notwork, TikTok makes it easy to connect with other users. This includes the ability to comment on and react to other users videos, follow their profits and download their content. Be aware that by default, any user can comment on your child's video if their account is set to public. Most interactions are harmless enough but as an app. TikTok is proce to predators because of the abundance of younger users.



ADDICTIVE NATURE

Social media is designed to be addictive and TikTok is no different. It can be fun and hugely extertaining. However, it is also because of this that it can be hard to put down, in addition to the short, punchy nature of the looping video format, the app's ability to keep you guessing what will come on screen next makes it easy to them a flow minute visit in 45 minute visit.

IN-APP PURCHASES

Aside from the centent, there's also the option to purchase in-app extras called "Rife" coins. Price range from 10.09 for 100 coins to an anye-watering 193.09 for 10.000 coins. TikTok coins are used to purchase different emojls to reward content creators that a user finds fumy or entertaining. In the 805 version of the app you can disable the option to buy TikTok coins but this sadly closent usem to be a feature in the Andord version.





Safety Tips For Parents



TALK ABOUT ONLINE DANGERS

Assuming your child is above the age limit to use the app, make sure you also take the time to talk to them about what they are seeing on the app, Have a disligue, get them to give you their opinion on what is appropriate and model the correct behaviour for them. Go over why they shouldn't give out private information or identifiable photos and be positive and understanding of them. In the long run, getting them to think critically about what they're seeing goes a long way to keeping them social media savey.



USE PRIVACY SETTINGS

Undoubtedly, the easiest way to safeguard your child on TikTok is to make sure their account is set to private. This means only those sures year child approves can view, like, and follow their content. Softling the account to private may dash with your shids good of social media superstandom, but it will keep their account socrue from strangers. This setting can be enabled under the privacy and safety menu by pressing the ellips in it the 'me' tab of the app. To be extra safe, there are additional controls available to toggle such as who can sent continents and messages, among other options.



ENABLE RESTRICTED MODE

In the digital well-being section there's the ability to turn on restricted mode using a PIM. Restricted mode using a PIM.
