## Travelling to school safely

It is likely that the roads and public transport system will be busier than when students returned in March, given other businesses have reopened.

- if you live a short distance from your school or college, walk, cycle or scoot to and from school wherever it is
  possible and safe to do so
- avoid sharing a car with anyone outside of your household or support bubble
- if you are using public transport to get to school or college, plan ahead and allow more time for your journey
- when you are travelling by public or dedicated school transport, don't forget to:
  - o wear a face covering (unless you are exempt including if you are aged 11 and under). It is important you wear them for the entirety of your journey, including inside a bus or train station
  - o social distance where possible
  - o wash or sanitise your hands regularly
  - o be considerate to fellow passengers and staff.

## **Responding to a suspected case of Coronavirus**

**Please do not send your child to school if they are unwell.** If they have a high temperature, loss of smell or taste or a new, continuous, dry cough, please let us know and book your child to be tested immediately. There is a list of other symptoms available on the NHS and Government website.

Anyone displaying Coronavirus symptoms in school will be sent home immediately and will need to follow the Government guidelines for self isolation.

- Child with symptoms will be sent home and must arrange a test
- Siblings will be sent home
- Other families in the class/bubble will be notified
- Other children in that group can continue to come to school until the test results are back
- If the test is positive, the symptomatic child must self- isolate for 10 days, siblings for 10 days and the same group children and staff for 10 days. We will also notify Public Health England in Southwark for further guidance
- If negative, the child can return when better
- If parents refuse to test their child, we will notify Public Health England in Southwark who will follow this up with the family, GP and complete a risk assessment. They will advise the school on our next steps.

## Asymptomatic testing information for parents and adults in households with children at school or college

Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are <u>different ways</u> for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests
- by ordering a home test kit online please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Children of primary school age (and below) without symptoms are not being asked to take a test.

Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other.

# What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

With more than 150 million users worldwide, Robiox is one of the most popular video games of recent times. Robiox allows users to create their own gaming experiences using Robiox Studio: building levels and games then blowing other people to play them. Similarly, players can play each other's creations, either on their own or with other people online. While it's a tool that can help foster creative thinking, Robiox is also intermittently in the news amid concerns over young users' safety.

#### No Age Rating

Roblox is rated 7+ by PEGI, but the platform itself doesn't have a minimum age requirement. It does ask for a date of birth when registering, but this can be easily fabricated. The sheer quantity of games available on Robics means that some will fail into teen/adult cotagories. Users can diso interact with each other heely – and the game has, historically, attracted scornmers, griefers and online redators

## In-App Purchases

Robux is the in-game currency used to buy things like opecial outfits or emotes, and to play certain sections of the game. A subscription service (costing 64.93 per month) called Robox Pannium offers more philleges and more in-game currency. reard more in-game carrency. Robux can also be purchased in batches, for up to C4.95. Children can cardly pay for these, or purchase a membership, without realising it.

#### **Online Predators**

Robian's developers ofm to maintain a safe place for children; they employ human moderators for their players' protection. But there will, soally, always be individuals who try to bypass these safeguards so they can chat to children and attempt to communicate outside the game. Anyane asking for your child's personal information or to talk privately should be blocked and reported
