# Staying Safe ON INTERNET CONNEETED DEVICES 

Following the visit from PC Fox and PC Hazel, here are some tips to help keep your child safe on internet connected devices at home.

1. Make a screen time plan with your child and display them clearly in the home.
2. When using the device, make sure you are in the same room as your child to ensure that they are staying safe and being kind while online.
3. Use the parent controls - ANDROID, IPHONE etc have parent controls to support being safe. Use these to set boundaries for your child.
4. Devices should be switched off and out of bedrooms overnight.

From Netflix to Disney + to Prime Video, there is a plethora of streaming services available. of streaming ser vices available. catering for younger viewers, they also provide material for more mature audiences. if you don't have parental controls set up on your parcounts, your child could find themselves being exposed to shows and movies with aduit themes, strong language and violence.

INCREASED SCREEN TIME
The array of content available through smart TVs could lead to your child spending excessive ampunts of time in iront of the
screen. Not only can prolonged screen time distract from important activities such as schoolwork or warned that endless hours in front of the box can lead to health problems the box can lead to hear sleproble patterns and depression

## REMOTE-CONIROL RETALL

Like many online devices, smart TVs facilitate digital purchases: buying a new app or the latest season of a favourite show, for example. If your child has access to a bank card and isn't restricted by spending controls on the system they could run up a sizeabie bill through a smart TV fairty quickly
especially if they're not quite old especially it they're not quite oid
enough to fully apprecidte the value enough to
of money.


## UNCONVINCING SECURITY

As internet of Things ( IoT ) devices,
smart TVs can betuiguciv. smart TVs can be uniquely vuinerabie to attack. Experts warn to supporthigh-level security software, so you won't always b able to downioad strong antivirus programmes like you would on a phone or computer. Being torgeted by hackers could be deeply upsetting for your child, as well as putting their personal data at risk.

## A SILENT SPY? Uv

Some smart TVs already collect dato on users viewing habits and then display targeted odvertising based on that personal information $=$ while there have also been reports of internet enabled TVs (and the apps installed on them) being used to: 'eavesdrop' on owners. in models with a bulit-in microphone (for voice activation), third parties could potentially fisten in on someone's home life.

CONTACT FROM STRANGERS

Many smart TVs can be used for web browsing, social media and live streaming - all of which could allow ynknown users to contact your child (or vice versa). If your child engages With these functions of the TV, a stranger could potentially discover their contact information and potentially then use it to obtain even more sensitive personal details, such as your home address.

## MAKE IT A FAMILY THING

Family TV time is a great way to model the responsible enjoyment of technology - showing your child how to uss the smart TV safely tor when they reold enough to watch it independently, You could also take this opportunity to establish some healthy TV boundaries, such as time limits on their daily viewing or how to make sure they're only watching content that's appropriate for their age

## SET UP PARENTAL CONTROLS

It's likely that your smart TV has built-in parental controls, which not only let you filter out age-inappropriate shows, movies and games but can also restrict in-app purchasing, so your child con' accidentally spend money through the device. When you'vo enabled these safecuards, have an open conversation with your child about the reasons, helping them to understand the potential risks.

## CREATE CHILD PROFILES

Much like with smartphones and tablets, apps con be downloaded onto smart TVs: from free content platforms such as BBC iliayer to paid-for services Ifke Prime Video, Most of these apps allow you to create a separate account for your child which has difterent settings to your own - suggesting more child-friendly material and reducing the possibility of them viewing explicit content.

## CONSIDER THE LOCATION

If you're concerned about the online safoty hazards that a smart TV might pose to your child, you could consider where in your home you put the device. The salest option would be to place the your home you purthe aevice. The salest option would be to place the able to supervise while your child's watching it - rather than in the relative privacy of a bedroom.
