Review: This plan will be evaluated termly by the PE Subject Leader working alongside the Leadership Team. The evaluated plan will be published each academic year. Evaluation will be through measuring participation, CPD evaluations, interviews with pupils and sports leaders, questionnaires with parents, staff and pupils.

It would be great to offer this to different class teachers in 2024/25. The Year 5 teacher (Oliver) was new to Snowsfields in September and attended the CPD Ks2 PE inset with LPESSN.

Teachers and Teaching Assistants have been joining in to support and inspire children to participate in the daily mile. Walk To School Week was promoted through the newsletter and the new walking zone map was shared in the corridor in September. We have been awarded the TfL Stars Gold School Award and the Gold Award for Healthy Schools. We will continue to collate evidence for these in readiness for the next renewal. A focus for the TfL is to encourage more children to scoot to school and wear helmets to promote road safety.

A large number of children from Snowsfields attend their after-school programme and holiday camps so giving the children the opportunity to give feedback has been great. The Girls in Year 6 had the opportunity to meet with LPESSN for the PE focus group. Listening to pupil voice and listening to their thoughts on recent competitions and workshops has been invaluable to improve provision. Sport Leaders (Years 3-6) have met every half term to tidy and organise the PE Cupboards. Moving resources and throwing away anything that is broken has been helpful and given them ownership over the schools equipment.
